

REPORT OF 2014 GRADUATING STUDENT SURVEY (GSS)

I. INTRODUCTION

In an effort to obtain outcomes and contact information from as many of our graduating students as possible, in Spring 2009 a brief 15-item Graduating Student Survey (GSS) was developed by the Office of Institutional Research with input from St. John's community. It was incorporated into the BANNER online process used by students, excluding School of Law, to register for participation in commencement exercises. The survey has been revised several times, and now it has 23 items, but the same procedure has been followed since 2009.

The total number of participants in GSS 2014 was 1,451 (38% of the 2013-14 graduating population): 925 undergraduates (44%) and 526 graduate students (30%). The survey participants were quite representative of the graduating student population in student gender and ethnicity.

This report, prepared by the Office of Institutional Research, consists of four sections, including this section of Introduction. Section II provides highlights of the survey results. Section III presents detailed findings. Section IV is the Summary and Discussion. The appendix to this report has the detailed data by college and by campus. Table 1 in the appendix has the longitudinal data for the university, from 2010 to 2014. Table 2 provides longitudinal data by campus. Table 3 presents the 2014 data by college. Tables 4a to 4e have longitudinal data for each college (SJC, 4a; EDU, 4b; CPS, 4c; TCB, 4d; Pharmacy, 4e). The survey form is also included in the appendix.

II. HIGHLIGHTS

Student overall satisfaction with their experience at St. John's has remained high for the past five classes with the SATISFIED and VERY SATISFIED ratings ranging 92 - 94% for undergraduates and 92 - 97% for graduate students. (Table 1 in the appendix, Question 20)

The proportion of students who had secured a job before graduation has revealed an upward trend for the past five classes. For undergraduates, it reached 36% in 2014 as compared to 24% in 2010. For graduate students, it was 55% in 2014 as compared to 44% in 2010. (Table 1, Q3)

The percentage of undergraduates who had internships (including student teaching and clinical rotation) also demonstrated an upward trend, from 53% in 2010 to 60% in

2014, while the percentages for graduate students fluctuated between 54% and 60%. (Table 1, Q6)

Graduate students' ratings on the quality of instruction have steadily increased: 87% rated it as GOOD or EXCELLENT in 2014 compared to 82% in 2010, while the percentages for undergraduates fluctuated around 80%. (Table 1, Q11)

The proportion of students with global experience did not change much for the past five classes: around 60% for undergraduates and a few points lower for graduate students. However, there has been an upward trend in student ratings on how well St. John's did at providing a global experience: 79% of undergraduates rated it as GOOD or EXCELLENT in 2014 compared to 75% in 2010; for graduate students, it was 77% in 2014 vs. 73% in 2010. (Table 1, Q15)

Student ratings on "tuition paid was a worthwhile investment" remained relatively low: the proportion of AGREE or STRONGLY AGREE ranged 65 – 69% for undergraduates and 75 - 77% for graduate students for the past five classes. (Table 1, Q14)

St. John's Catholic and Vincentian Mission had more impact on undergraduates than graduate students: 73% of undergraduates in 2014 felt POSITIVELY or VERY POSITIVELY impacted as compared to 66% of graduate students. (Table 1, Q17)

Student overall satisfaction is strongly related to the quality of instruction and the college GPA was positively related to student ratings on quality of instruction and tuition paid as a worthwhile investment.

The ratings by students on Staten Island campus have been consistently higher than the ratings by students on Queens campus. (Table 2)

In general, ratings by graduate students have been higher than by undergraduates. (Table 1)

III. DETAILED SURVEY RESULTS

This section covers detailed survey results. It consists of two parts. The first part provides the university-level trend data for the past five classes, 2010 to 2014. The second part summarizes the 2014 data, presenting the results at both the university and college levels.

1. University-Level Trend Data for the Past Five Classes

Student overall satisfaction with their experience at St. John's has remained high for the past five classes with the SATISFIED and VERY SATISFIED ratings ranging 92 - 94% for undergraduates and 92 - 97% for graduate students. (Table 1, Question 20)

The proportion of students who had secured a job before graduation has revealed an upward trend for the past five classes. For undergraduates, it reached 36% (20%

keeping current jobs and 16% accepted a job offer) in 2014 as compared to 24% (14% keeping current jobs and 10% accepted a job offer) in 2010. For graduate students, it was 55% (31% keeping current jobs and 24% accepted a job offer) in 2014 as compared to 44% (27% keeping current jobs and 17% accepted a job offer) in 2010. (Table 1, Q3)

The percentage of undergraduates who had internships (including student teaching and clinical rotation) also demonstrated an upward trend, from 53% in 2010 to 60% in 2014, while the percentages for graduate students fluctuated between 54% and 60%. (Table 1, Q6)

Graduate students' ratings on the quality of instruction have steadily increased: 87% rated it as GOOD or EXCELLENT in 2014 compared to 82% in 2010, while the percentages for undergraduates fluctuated around 80%. (Table 1, Q11)

The proportion of students with global experience did not change much for the past five classes: around 60% for undergraduates and a few points lower for graduate students. However, there has been an upward trend in student ratings on how well St. John's did at providing a global experience: 79% of undergraduates rated it as GOOD or EXCELLENT in 2014 compared to 75% in 2010; for graduate students, it was 77% in 2014 vs. 73% in 2010. (Table 1, Q15)

Student ratings on "tuition paid was a worthwhile investment" remained relatively low: the proportion of AGREE or STRONGLY AGREE ranged 65 – 69% for undergraduates and 75 - 77% for graduate students for the past five classes. (Table 1, Q14)

St. John's Catholic and Vincentian Mission had more impact on undergraduates than graduate students: 73% of undergraduates in 2014 felt POSITIVELY or VERY POSITIVELY impacted as compared to 66% of graduate students. (Table 1, Q17)

The ratings by students on Staten Island campus have been consistently higher than the ratings by students on Queens campus. (Table 2)

In general, ratings by graduate students have been higher than by undergraduates. (Table 1)

2. Results of GSS 2014 at Both the University and College Levels

This section mainly summarizes the GSS 2014 data at the university level. The college-level data are also presented, together with the university-level results. Caution should be used when interpreting the college-level data, mainly for two reasons. First, both the population and the number of responses were low for some colleges. Therefore, the ratings for such colleges were more likely to fluctuate than for other colleges. The following table provides data on population and responses by college for GSS 2014:

Due to the fact that students may skip questions, the number of responses to a particular question may be smaller than the figures presented in the above table. Table 3 in the appendix has the number of responses to each question in the survey.

The second reason for using caution in interpreting the college-level data is that the PharmD graduates were presented as graduate students. These students actually spent most of their time as undergraduates at St John's, while in general, ratings by undergraduates were lower than by graduate students. Therefore, this might partly explain the relatively low ratings by Pharmacy graduate students.

This section consists of five parts: 1) Student overall perceptions, 2) Internships, job status, and further education for undergraduates, 3) Internships, job status, and further education for graduate students, 4) Global experience, technology, and academic advising, and 5) St. John's Catholic and Vincentian Mission, services, activities, and alumni relations.

2a. Student Overall Perceptions

Student satisfaction with their overall experience at St. John's remained high. As the table below indicates, at the university level 92% of undergraduates and 97% of graduate students were SATISFIED / VERY SATISFIED.

Regarding the quality of instruction, 79% of undergraduates and 87% of graduate students rated it as GOOD / EXCELLENT.

When asked to what extent St. John's core courses added value to their undergraduate education, 86% of undergraduates and 88% of graduate students indicated TO A LARGE / SOME EXTENT. (The graduate students who responded to this question include students who received their undergraduate education from St. John's, and those in the combined programs (bachelor's and master's, PharmD, etc.).

2b. Internships, Job Status, and Further Education: Undergraduates

When asked about their plans after graduation, as the table below reveals, 20% of undergraduates indicated that they would keep their current jobs, 16% had accepted a job offer, 34% were planning to further their education, 30% were still looking for a job, and 0% had no plan.

The data indicate that 54% of undergraduates had internships. When student teaching and clinical rotation were included, this figure increased to 60%. Regarding the type of internships that students completed, 33% had academic internships for credit, 18% experienced paid internships, 17% had unpaid internships (non-credit), 5% completed student teaching, and 3% had clinical rotations (This is a check-all-that-apply question. The total percentage may add up to more than 60%.).

The data indicate that 45% of graduate students had internships. When student teaching and clinical rotation were included, this figure increased to 58%. Regarding the type of internships that students completed, 24% had academic internships for credit, 20% experienced paid internships, 10% had unpaid internships (non-credit), 9% completed student teaching, and 15% had clinical rotations.

For graduate students, 50% indicated YES for alumni relations events, 21% for leadership roles in organizing alumni functions, 23% for recruitment events with the Office of Admissions, 35% for mentoring roles with students, and 52% for assistance with career decisions and job search.

IV. SUMMARY AND DISCUSSION

In general the results from this GSS survey are consistent with the findings from other surveys such as NSSE (National Survey of Student Engagement) and SSI (Student Satisfaction Inventory): student overall satisfaction is strongly related to the quality of instruction; the college GPA was positively related to student ratings on quality of instruction and tuition paid as a worthwhile investment.

When asked to what extent St. John's core courses added value to their undergraduate education, the perceptions from graduate students (who received their undergraduate education from St. John's) were slightly more positive than the perceptions of those who have just completed their undergraduate education.

The survey results reveal that around two-fifths of both undergraduate and graduate students indicated that they had no exposure to a global experience while at St. John's through study abroad, in the classroom or through student activities. This is a challenge to our objective in the 2008 - 2014 Strategic Plan that specified global experience as one of the University priorities. Actions should be taken for further improvement.

The results of this GSS survey are the perceptions of students who have successfully completed their programs at St. John's. The data are very useful, and can be used with other data for action plans and improvement purposes.
